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APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. Return the application forms before May 8th directly to the Dean of the Summer Session, University of Notre Dame, Notre Dame, Indiana. RETURN ALL COPIES INTACT. DO NOT SELECT COURSES WITHOUT THE PRIOR APPROVAL OF YOUR ADVISOR. If you have not received the prior approval of your advisor, RETURN THE FORM AFTER YOU HAVE COMPLETED ALL BUT THE COURSE SCHEDULE PORTION. THIS MAY BE COMPLETED ON REGISTRATION DAY. CURRENT STUDENTS AT THE UNIVERSITY MUST APPLY FOR ADMISSION TO THE SUMMER SESSION, NOT TO THE DEAN OF THEIR COLLEGE.
2. If you have earned college credit elsewhere since your LAST attendance at the University of Notre Dame, or if you are a NEW student, you must forward TWO transcripts of this work to the Dean of the Summer Session, University of Notre Dame, BEFORE YOU WILL BE ADMITTED OR PERMITTED TO REGISTER.
3. AFTER THE APPLICATION FORM IS RETURNED, CHANGES MAY NOT BE MADE UNTIL YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS. ADVANCE REQUESTS FOR AUDITS WILL NOT BE HONORED. YOU MAY APPLY FOR AUDITS AFTER YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS AND REGISTER. AUDITS COST THE SAME PER SEMESTER HOUR AS COURSES TAKEN FOR CREDIT.
4. You will receive from the Office of Student Accounts a "Statement of Account" which will also specify the registration procedures. To save yourself much inconvenience on REGISTRATION DAY, MONDAY, JUNE 21, 1965 - you are urged to return the APPLICATION FORM by MAY 8, 1965 and to pay your fees by Friday, June 4, 1965. A late application fee of \$10.00 is applicable after May 8, 1965.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

5. DO NOT CONTACT ANY OTHER OFFICE EXCEPT THE DEAN OF THE SUMMER SESSION UNTIL AFTER YOUR COPY OF THE COMPLETED APPLICATION HAS BEEN RETURNED TO YOU.
6. NO COMMITMENTS FOR ROOMS, CLASSES OR OTHER FACILITIES WILL BE HONORED UNLESS THE DEAN OF THE SUMMER SESSION HAS PROCESSED YOUR APPLICATION FORM AND RETURNED A COPY OF THE FORM TO YOU. NO COMMITMENTS BY ANY ONE EXCEPT THE DEAN OF THE SUMMER SESSION WILL BE HONORED.
7. DO NOT ARRIVE ON CAMPUS PRIOR TO THE AFTERNOON OF SUNDAY, JUNE 20, 1965 since university facilities are committed. The dormitories will be occupied and space will not be available.
8. INFORMATION CONCERNING THE NUMBERING OF COURSES; THE CLASS-HOUR CODE WILL BE FOUND ON PAGE 7.

## REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR MONDAY &amp; TUESDAY, JUNE 21 &amp; 22, 1965

9. ALL STUDENTS MUST REGISTER AT STEPAN CENTER AND PAY FEES IN THE ORDER SHOWN ON PAGE 7. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO REGISTER OR PAY FEES EARLIER ON REGISTRATION DAY THAN THE TIME PRESCRIBED SINCE NEITHER YOUR PACKET NOR STUDENT ACCOUNT WILL BE AVAILABLE. STUDENTS MAY PAY FEES BEFORE JUNE 4, 1965 BUT THEY MUST STILL REPORT TO STEPAN CENTER IN THE ORDER SHOWN AND COMPLETE REGISTRATION.
10. AT STEPAN CENTER YOU WILL RECEIVE THE SCHEDULE FOR WHICH YOU PRE-REGISTERED. IF YOU WISH TO MAKE A SCHEDULE CHANGE, OR FAILED TO PRE-REGISTER, OR YOU WISH TO SEE YOUR ADVISOR, YOU MUST REPORT TO O'SHAUGHNESSY HALL AFTER YOU CHECK OUT OF STEPAN CENTER.
11. ALL NEW OR RETURNING STUDENTS WHO DID NOT RECEIVE NOTIFICATION THAT ALL OF THEIR RECORDS (INCLUDING TRANSCRIPTS) WERE COMPLETELY PROCESSED MUST REPORT TO THE OFFICE OF THE DEAN OF THE SUMMER SESSION (ROOM 219), ADMINISTRATION BUILDING (GOLD DOME), BEFORE ATTEMPTING TO REGISTER AND PAY FEES AT STEPAN CENTER.
12. PERMISSION FOR LATE REGISTRATION MUST BE OBTAINED IN ADVANCE FROM THE DEAN OF THE SUMMER SESSION AND WILL BE GRANTED UNDER SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES ONLY. THERE IS A FEE OF \$10.00 IN ALL CASES.
