APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. Return the application forms before May 7th directly to the Dean of the Summer Session, University of Notre Dame, Notre Dame, Indiana. RETURN ALL COPIES INTACT.
2. CURRENT STUDENTS AT THE UNIVERSITY MUST APPLY FOR ADMISSION TO THE SUMMER SESSION, NOT TO THE DEAN OF THEIR COLLEGE.
3. If you have earned college credit elsewhere since your LAST attendance at the University of Notre Dame, or if you are a NEW student, you must forward TWO transcripts of this work to the Dean of the Summer Session, University of Notre Dame, BEFORE YOU WILL BE ADMITTED OR PERMITTED TO REGISTER.
4. AFTER THE APPLICATION FORM IS RETURNED, CHANGES MAY NOT BE MADE UNTIL YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS. ADVANCE REQUESTS FOR AUDITS WILL NOT BE HONORED. YOU MAY APPLY FOR AUDITS AFTER YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS AND REGISTER. AUDIT CHARGES ARE THE SAME PER SEMESTER HOUR AS COURSES TAKEN FOR CREDIT.
5. You will receive from the Office of Student Accounts a "Statement of Account" which will also specify the registration procedures. To save yourself much inconvenience on REGISTRATION DAY, MONDAY, JUNE 20, 1966--you are urged to return the APPLICATION FORM by MAY 7, 1966 and to pay your fees by Friday, June 3, 1966. A late application fee of \$10.00 is applicable after May 7, 1966.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. DO NOT CONTACT ANY OTHER OFFICE EXCEPT THE DEAN OF THE SUMMER SESSION UNTIL AFTER YOUR COPY OF THE COMPLETED APPLICATION HAS BEEN RETURNED TO YOU.
2. NO COMMITMENTS FOR ROOMS, CLASSES OR OTHER FACILITIES WILL BE HONORED UNLESS THE DEAN OF THE SUMMER SESSION HAS PROCESSED YOUR APPLICATION FORM AND RETURNED A COPY OF THE FORM TO YOU. NO COMMITMENTS BY ANY ONE EXCEPT THE DEAN OF THE SUMMER SESSION WILL BE HONORED.
3. DO NOT ARRIVE ON CAMPUS PRIOR TO THE AFTERNOON OF SUNDAY, JUNE 19, 1966 since university facilities are committed. The dormitories will be occupied and space will not be available.

FINAL REGISTRATION AND FEE PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS MONDAY & TUESDAY, JUNE 20, 21, 1966 STEPAN CENTER

1. ALL NEW OR RETURNING STUDENTS WHO DID NOT RECEIVE NOTIFICATION THAT ALL OF THEIR RECORDS (INCLUDING TRANSCRIPTS) WERE COMPLETELY PROCESSED MUST REPORT TO THE OFFICE OF THE DEAN OF THE SUMMER SESSION (ROOM 219), ADMINISTRATION BUILDING (GOLDEN DOME), BEFORE ATTEMPTING TO REGISTER AND PAY FEES AT STEPAN CENTER.
2. PERMISSION FOR LATE REGISTRATION MUST BE OBTAINED IN ADVANCE FROM THE DEAN OF THE SUMMER SESSION AND WILL BE GRANTED UNDER SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES ONLY. THERE IS A FEE OF \$10.00 IN ALL CASES.
3. ALL STUDENTS MUST REPORT TO STEPAN CENTER IN ORDER SHOWN ON PAGE 7. DO NOT REPORT EARLIER--PACKETS WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE.
