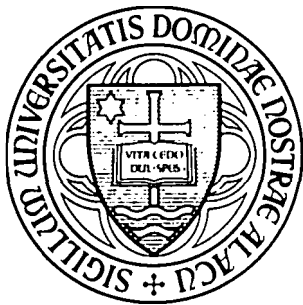

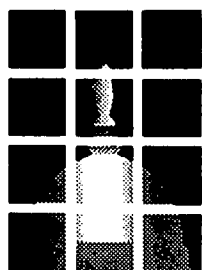

A MESSAGE FROM THE REGISTRAR

This spring we will be using the Direct Access Registration by Telephone (DART) on-line registration system for the second time. We continue to receive excellent suggestions for improvements in the DART system and have included as many as possible for this registration. Other changes, requiring more time to install, will be added at future registrations.

Registration for the 1990 fall semester will take place between March 26 and April 10, 1990. After this, DART will continue to be available for adding and dropping courses through the last day for class changes in the fall semester, Wednesday, September 5, 1990.

This booklet contains all the information necessary to register for classes. It lists all the courses offered in the fall arranged alphabetically by department and by the time of day the course is offered. Academic regulations affecting students are summarized in this DART book: please keep it as a reference. We will publish an abbreviated schedule of courses, containing section locations, shortly before the beginning of the fall semester.

Terminals will be available in the Registrar's Office to provide another way of submitting data to the DART computer. The instructions in this booklet (except those which deal exclusively with telephones) refer to either terminal or telephone input.

We have created a 10-minute video describing DART. It will be shown in the Center for Continuing Education on Tuesday, March 20 and Wednesday, March 21, at 6:30 p.m., 7:15 p.m., and 8:00 p.m. If you have not used DART before, be sure to see it at one of these times. Copies of

the video will be lent to any group that would like a private showing. Call the Registrar's Office to make arrangements.

You will be given an appointment to use DART during the Registration period (3/26 - 4/10) between 12 noon and 7 p.m. After your appointment is over, you can call DART at any time during the unrestricted add-drop period, Monday - Friday, 7 p.m.-12 midnight; Saturday and Sunday, 9 a.m. - 12 midnight. The courses and sections which are added or reopened will be published in the Observer, the Registrar's Office, and in the departmental offices.

Regulations governing the pass/fail option, auditing, overloads, etc. are discussed on pages 5-9. Plan your schedule carefully before attempting to register.

1. Use the Program Planning sheet (on the back cover) and the DART Registration Worksheet (a sample worksheet is reproduced on page 15).
2. Have several course or section alternatives ready in case some sections are closed.

You must still ENROLL during the first week of the spring semester even though you register for classes using DART. Enrollment is discussed on page 8.

We believe that DART has made registration easy and convenient, but we continue to need your help to make the system effective. If you encounter any problems with DART or if you have any suggestions on how to improve it, call us at 239-7043.

REGULATIONS AND POLICIES

CONTINUING STUDENTS

REGISTRATION APPOINTMENTS

Registration appointments for degree-seeking students will be scheduled in order of student level. Within each level, appointments will be made randomly at times which don't conflict with your current class schedule.

The levels and appointment week for post-baccalaureate students are as follows:

A *Registration Appointment Schedule* will be sent to your local address about two weeks before Registration. Make sure the Registrar's Office has your correct local address!

The *Registration Appointment Schedule* contains the time and date of your registration appointment. It also includes the personal data which the Registrar's Office currently has on record and lists the department or college location where you may obtain the Personal Identification Number (PIN) which you will need to gain access to DART.

Your appointment will be a 15 minute period during which you can dial DART at 219-283-3003 (3003 from the Dorms) to select courses or you may use the terminals in the Registrar's Office. If you get a busy signal when you call, keep trying. You should be able to get through and obtain your courses during the scheduled time. It should take less than five minutes to register for your courses if you prepare in advance. Your registration session will be cut off after 7.5 minutes. You may re-enter DART immediately if there is still time left in your 15 minute appointment.

Non-degree students can use the add/drop periods starting April 11. All non-degree students must be admitted before they can register for classes.

STUDENT ADVISING, PIN & WORKSHEET

Make an appointment with your department or college advisor to obtain your unique DART access PIN. A PIN will be generated for each student whom we expect to register and will be valid through September 5, 1990.

The two-part Registration Worksheets will be available in your departmental or college offices (as well as the Registrar's Office). Use them to plan out your class schedule. A sample worksheet is shown on page 15.

The worksheet contains a section for your desired schedule and a space for alternative courses or sections. Bring the worksheet to your advisor when obtaining your PIN. After you and your advisor agree on a proposed schedule, your advisor will retain a copy. Be sure to fill in the Call Number and the Authorization Number (if required) for each course you desire before calling DART.

After Registration, you will be sent a copy of the courses for which you registered. Duplicate copies will also be sent to your department and your Dean's Office. Check

with your advisor before making any changes to your schedule after Registration.

REGISTRATION BY PERMISSION

Obtain authorization for each "Course Requiring Permission to Register" from the department offering the course.

DART generates a sequence of authorization numbers (AN's) for each "Course Requiring Permission to Register", equal to the maximum number of students in the course (listed in the University Course Schedule portion of this booklet). Write the AN, obtained from the department, on your Registration Worksheet.

When you register for the course, you will be asked by the telephone voice (or terminal) response for the Authorization Number. If (and only if) your AN matches one of the un-used ANs for that course, you will be allowed to register for the course.

PASS/FAIL OPTION

Juniors and Seniors (only) may take one Pass/Fail course per semester or three 1-credit mini courses. The course may not be in or required by your program. Permission of your Dean is required for all Pass/Fail Course changes. The last day for all Pass/Fail Option changes for the 1990-91 fall semester is September 5, 1990.

You must register for a course before you can choose the Pass/Fail Option.

All Pass/Fail Option changes are processed at your Dean's Office. When your Dean approves your Pass/Fail Option permission (or change), he will enter the information directly into the DART computer. You will not have to come to the Registrar's Office. The registrar will convert the grade reported by the instructor to an entry of *pass* or *fail* on your record. No notice of the pass/fail decision will be communicated to the instructor.

The Pass/Fail option is also available to students in the Law School but is limited to a total of two non-required courses, and only with the permission of the course instructor. These courses cannot be taken in the same semester. Permission must be obtained from the Law School Coordinator of Admissions and Registration.

CLASS LOADS

DART will not allow you to register for an overload course schedule without permission from your Dean. The number of credits constituting an overload depends on your college or school. The maximum number of credits allowed is:

The following courses do not count in the overload calculation:

All AS, MSCI, NSCI courses; MUS 100D (varsity band), MUS 101D (chamber orchestra), MUS 103D (glee club), MUS 104D (chapel choir), MUS 107D (concert band), MUS 121D (jazz ensemble), MUS 203D (choral), private music lessons, and Urban Plunge.

You must obtain permission from your Dean to register for more than the maximum number of credits. After granting permission, the Dean will enter your new maximum directly into the DART computer.

FULL/PART TIME STATUS

An undergraduate degree-seeking student carrying fewer than 12 credit hours per semester is considered to be a **part-time** student. Full-time students, already enrolled in the University, who wish to convert to part-time status, must request permission from their Dean before the start of the semester in which part-time status is desired. If such permission is granted, the Dean must notify the Office of Student Accounts before the start of the semester.

RESTRICTED ACCESS TO COURSES

There are a number of restrictions a department might place on a course during registration. For example, courses can be reserved for departmental majors (or non-majors) or, e.g., ROTC students; courses can be restricted to a certain level, such as freshman; or a course can be reserved for a given group (major, level, etc.) during registration and later opened to other students.

Any restrictions requested by a department will be listed with the prerequisites associated with the course. These will be found in the University Course Schedule section starting on page 20.

If, as Registration proceeds, a restriction is removed, it will be noted in the daily report of closed and newly opened sections in the Observer and at the Registrar's Office. You can use the unrestricted call back periods, after your appointment has expired, during Registration. After Registration, you can use DART during normal office hours to select courses that have been opened.

ENROLLMENT

You must enroll in person. Enrollment Day is Monday, August 27, 1990, between 8:30 a.m. and 3:15 p.m., at the Joyce ACC. After August 27, you must enroll at the Registrar's Office. To enroll, you complete an Enrollment Form: write and/or marksense all the information requested and sign the form. Give the completed form to an enrollment clerk who will retain the top copy and stamp and return the carbon copy to you. Retain this copy as proof of enrollment.

Note: Students who do not enroll by Wednesday, September 5, will be removed from the revised class lists for all of their courses. After this date, a late fee of \$25.00 will be charged to add a student to the class lists.

COURSE AUDITS

All regulations and restrictions regarding admission to a course remain in effect, whether or not the course is taken for audit or credit.

Course audits do not appear on undergraduate student transcripts.

SAINT MARY'S COLLEGE COURSES

ADDING SAINT MARY'S COURSES

Do not use DART. Notre Dame students are permitted to register for Saint Mary's College courses if space permits and if the course prerequisites are met. To register for SMC courses, come to the Notre Dame Registrar's Office to fill out a *Saint Mary's Intent* form by April 20. Acceptance into SMC courses is not automatic. Saint Mary's College registration is April 19-26. If accepted, SMC course selections will appear on your schedule after April 30.

You may also add an SMC course on the first day of classes (August 28). Notre Dame students must go to the SMC department offering the course, obtain an SMC add slip, and return it to the Notre Dame Registrar's Office to have the course added to your schedule.

DROPPING SAINT MARY'S COURSES

SMC courses may be dropped using DART. As with Notre Dame courses, you may use DART to drop SMC courses through the first seven class days of the semester (April 30, 1990 through September 5, 1990).

NEW STUDENTS

INTRODUCTION

This section applies to New Graduate Students, Undergraduate Transfer and Re-admitted Students, and Students returning from Leaves of Absence.

A separate enrollment and course registration process has been arranged to ease your entry or return to the University of Notre Dame. You will receive academic counselling, select courses, and enroll the day before all continuing students enroll.

STUDENT I.D. CARD

Since you do not have a valid student I.D. card, you must have an I.D. card photograph taken at the Joyce ACC. You will be given temporary I.D. cards at that time. Follow the Student Photo I.D. Card Regulations located on page 17.

ACADEMIC ADVISING AND REGISTRATION FOR COURSES

You will obtain academic advising and complete your course registration on Friday, August 24, 1990. The DART terminal room in the Registrar's Office (215 Main Building) will be reserved for your use on that day from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. After this period, you will be able to use the DART terminal or telephone system without appointment, to change or to check your academic schedule.

Your two-part Registration Worksheet should be obtained at your Departmental or Dean's Office. Check your

department regarding advising and obtaining registration materials.

The registration details are the same as described for continuing students and are found on pages 6 - 8.

ENROLLMENT

Graduate Students

You must enroll in person at the Joyce ACC on Friday, August 24, 1990, between noon and 3 p.m.

To enroll, complete an Enrollment Form: write and/or marksense all the information requested and sign the form. Give the completed form to an enrollment clerk who will retain the top copy and stamp and return to you the carbon copy. This copy should be retained as proof of enrollment.

Undergraduate Students

You must enroll in person at the Joyce ACC on Friday, August 24, 1990, between 9 a.m. and noon.

To enroll, complete an Enrollment Form: write and/or marksense all the information requested and sign the form. Give the completed form to an enrollment clerk who will retain the top copy and stamp and return to you the carbon copy. This copy should be retained as proof of enrollment.

ONE

Organize Your Registration Material

You will need the following to register:

- DART Worksheet
- PIN (Personal Identification Number)
- Authorization Numbers (AN's) for all Courses by Permission

TWO

Complete the DART Worksheet

Check your program requirements and choose your courses and alternates. Enter the following for each course:

- Course Call Number, e.g., 0 4 6 6
- AN (if required), e.g., 1 2 3 4 5 6
- Course Abbreviation, e.g., ARST
- Course Number, e.g., 325S
- Section Number, e.g., 01

Bring the completed worksheet to your advisor to obtain your PIN.

THREE

Register

Use any Touchtone Telephone or a terminal in the Registrar's Office.

You may add, drop, audit, or list courses or change the number of credits (variable credit course only).

A voice (or terminal) response will guide you at each step. Follow the instructions.

To end the session, hang up the telephone (or enter * B Y E on the terminal).

Step Two

Complete the
DART Worksheet

Use the Program Planning Sheet (back cover) to plan your spring semester schedule. Include alternative courses/sections in case some of the courses/sections you request are closed.

Enter the following information for each course and alternate on the DART Worksheet:

- 4-digit Call Number (e.g., 0466)
- AN (if required)
- Course Abbreviation (e.g., ARST)
- Course Number (e.g., 325S)
- Section Number (e.g., 01)

List those classes for which there are no alternative sections first. Bring the completed worksheet to your advisor to obtain your PIN.

Step Three

Register

Dial DART from any Touchtone Telephone or go to the Terminal Room (215 Main Building)

(Bring your completed worksheet)

To enter DART dial 219-283-3003 from any touchtone telephone or come to the terminal room in the Registrar's Office during your 15 minute appointment.

Your registration session will be cut off 7.5 minutes after you start the session. If you prepare your worksheet in advance, it should take less than 5 minutes to register for classes. You can re-enter DART immediately if there is still time left in your 15 minute appointment. If not, or if you miss your appointment, use any unrestricted add/drop period (M-F, 7 p.m.- 12 midnight; Saturday and Sunday, 9 a.m.-12 midnight) after your appointment is over.

DART will allow you to add, drop or audit a course, review your schedule, or change the number of credits of a variable credit course. To end the session, hang up the telephone or enter * *B Y E* [Return] on the terminal.

A voice (or terminal) response will guide you after each entry. Follow the instructions. It is not necessary to wait until the entire message is over. If you know what you want to do, go ahead and do it, even if the message is not finished.

If you make a mistake, you can erase your input by pressing *# on the telephone or using the backspace key (not the left arrow key) on the terminal.

Enter Dart

Dial the DART telephone number: 219 - 2 8 3 - 3 0 0 3 (3003 from Dorm phones) or press the return key [Return] on the terminals).

Enter your 9-digit student I.D. number (without dashes or spaces), * , your 4-digit PIN (obtained from your department), * , the Semester Code for the semester in which you are registering (e.g., Summer '90, 9 0 0; Fall '90, 9 0 1; Spring '91, 9 0 2), #.

E.g., 0 7 1 2 0 6 5 4 4 * 1 7 7 6 * 9 0 1 #.

To add a Course

Enter the 4-digit course Call Number followed by # , e.g., 0 4 6 6 #. On the terminal, the return key [Return] is equivalent to the # on the telephone. If you are not already enrolled in the course, DART will assume you want to add the course. DART will confirm that the course has been added, e.g.,

(Student enters 0 4 6 6 #)

"You have requested Call Number 0466. If you wish to add this Call Number, press the number sign (#)."

(Student enters #)

"Art Studio 325S, section 01, has been added to your Spring 1990 schedule. Your total number of credits is 3. Please make a request".

(Note: DART responses are in italics)

To add a Course with an Authorization Number

Enter the 4-digit course Call number followed by *, the 6-digit Authorization number and #.
For example, 0 4 6 6 * 1 2 3 4 5 6 #.

To drop a Course

Enter the 4-digit course Call Number followed by #, e.g., 0 4 6 6 #. If you are already enrolled in the course, DART will assume you want to drop the course. DART will confirm that the course has been dropped e.g.,

(Student enters 0 4 6 6 #)

"You have requested Call Number 0466. If you wish to drop this course, press the number (#) sign".

(Student enters #)

"Art Studio 325S, section 01, has been dropped from your Fall, 1990 schedule. Your total number of credits is 12. Please make a request"

To list a course

Enter 1 followed by #. The first course for which you are registered will be given (voice response on the telephone or a listing on the terminal). You can then dial 2 # to review your second course, 1 # to repeat the first course, or enter another number.

To audit a course

If you have not registered for the course, enter a 4-digit course Call number, * 4 4 4 and #. For example, 0 4 6 6 * 4 4 4 #.

If you've registered for the course for credit and wish to change to audit, enter the 4-digit course Call number, then * 4 4 4 and #. For example, 0 4 6 6 * 4 4 4 #.

If you wish to change an audit course to credit, enter the 4-digit course Call number, * 5 5 5 and #. For example, 0 4 6 6 * 5 5 5 #.

To change the credits of a variable credit course

To change the number of credits of a variable credit course for which you have already registered, enter the 4-digit course Call number, *, the number of credits and #. For example, to change a variable credit course from 1 to 2 credits, enter 0 4 6 6 * 2 #.

To change the semester

To change the semester of the session, re-enter the log-on sequence. For example, if you are registering for the Fall 1990 semester and wish to list the courses of the current Spring 1990 semester, enter 0 7 1 2 0 6 5 4 4 * 1 7 7 6 * 8 9 2 #.

To correct a mistake

Press *# and start again. On the terminal, use the backspace key (not the left arrow key).

To end the session

Just hang up. On the terminal, enter * B Y E followed by the return key.

This Worksheet can be used for both telephone and terminal registration. Only a Touch Tone telephone can be used to make entries. Touch Tone telephones have a different tone for each button. Telephones that make no tone or the same tone for each button pressed will not work. If you are using a terminal, ignore those instructions which deal exclusively with telephones.

A voice or terminal response will guide you after each entry. Follow the instructions. It is not necessary to wait for the end of the message. As soon as you know what you want to do, you may start. Each action sequence must end with a # (telephone) or the Return key (terminal).

If you make a mistake, you may erase your input by pressing *# (telephone) or using the **Backspace** key (terminal).

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

STUDENT PHOTO I.D. CARD REGULATIONS

PHOTO I.D. CARD

This laminated, multi-year card contains, in addition to your photograph, an embossed and printed name and student I.D. (social security) number. The back of the card contains a magnetically encoded strip which is used for charging meals in the dining halls, laundry services, check cashing and/or bookstore charges. A bar code strip is also on the back for the use of the University library.

You are responsible for the care and safekeeping of the card. There is a \$12.00 fee for its replacement.

1. Keep the card in the plastic holder in which it was issued to protect it from damage and wear.
2. Protect the magnetically encoded information by keeping the card away from magnetic fields such as those generated by television sets, stereo speakers, bulk tape erasers, radio transmitters, personal computers, etc. These could erase the information encoded on the card.
3. If you clean the card, use only mild soap and warm water.

TEMPORARY VALI-DINE CARD

This is a non-photo laminated card which contains a magnetically coded strip on the back. It is issued to you

to use while your photo I.D. card is being prepared. You must return this card in exchange for your permanent photo I.D. card or a \$6.00 fee will be charged.

TEMPORARY PAPER I.D. CARD

This is a non-photo card which contains printed student data. It is issued to you along with the temporary Vali-dine card to use as your official Student Identification Card while your permanent photo I.D. card is being prepared. You must return this card in exchange for your permanent I.D. card or a \$6.00 fee will be charged.

REPLACEMENT OF LOST OR STOLEN I.D. CARDS

Report to the Registrar's Office if your I.D. card(s) has been lost or stolen. This is particularly important because the lost or stolen card must be invalidated.

You are strongly encouraged to make every effort to recover your missing I.D. card. Once a replacement card of any kind is issued or your photograph is retaken, no refund will be made for the missing card.

If you find a lost I.D. card, please call the I.D. clerk in the Registrar's Office (239-6488) who will have the student contact you to retrieve the card. Please do not mail the card to us or to any other office.

FAMILY EDUCATION RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT "DIRECTORY" INFORMATION

The University has designated certain information contained in the education records of its students as Directory Information for purposes of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

This includes: (1) full name, (2) address, (3) telephone number, (4) date and place of birth, (5) college, major or level, (6) participation in officially recognized activities and sports, (7) weight and height of members of athletic teams, (8) dates of attendance, (9) full or part-time status, (10) degrees and awards received, (11) the most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student, and (12) other similar information such as a photograph.

Directory information may be disclosed by this institution for any purpose, without the consent of a student. Students have the right to refuse to have this information disclosed.

Any student refusing to have the designated directory information disclosed must file written notification to this effect with the Registrar's Office on or before April 9, 1990.

In the event that a refusal is not filed, the University assumes that the student does not object to the release of the directory information.

TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

All transcript requests must be made in writing. You may fill out a **Transcript Request Form** in the Registrar's Office or send a letter to:

The request should include your full name, dates of attendance, social security number, address of person, school or company where transcript is to be sent, your return address, and your signature. A Transcript cannot be ordered by telephone. You may send the request by FAX machine instead of mail, however the transcript itself will be mailed. Our fax number is (219) 239-5872.

There is a charge of \$2.00 for each transcript. Requests for transcripts will not be honored if you are financially indebted to the University.

Transcripts are normally mailed directly to the person, school or company you indicated. Transcripts may also be picked up by the student in the Registrar's Office, 2 to 3 days after receipt of the request but will be stamped **ISSUED TO STUDENT**.

The University issues transcripts only of the academic work done at Notre Dame. Requests for transcripts of courses taken at other institutions should be directed to those institutions.

In general, evaluative information such as courses completed, grades earned, etc., cannot be issued to an outside party unless the student has given the Registrar written permission to release it to that specific party. The Registrar may, however, disclose directory information without the student's stated permission as allowed under FERPA (cf., page 17).

ADDRESS CHANGES

Report changes in your home or local addresses and telephone number(s) to the Registrar's Office, 215 Main Building.

ACADEMIC CODE OF HONOR

All undergraduate students, except seniors, are governed by the procedures outlined in the *Academic Code of Honor Handbook*. All courses without any seniors enrolled will follow the provisions outlined in the *Handbook*. Courses with only seniors enrolled will follow these procedures if

all the students in the class approve. Courses with seniors and other undergraduates enrolled are governed by the provisions of the Code subject to the discretion of the department offering the course.

ADDITIONAL ACADEMIC INFORMATION

CLASS RANKINGS

Class rankings are calculated separately for each undergraduate college and level. Cumulative averages are used and include all courses taken at Notre Dame for which a grade was received and credit given.

REPEATED COURSES

No course may be repeated unless grades of "U" or "F" were received. Both the original grade ("U" or "F") and the repeated grade will appear on the student's transcript.
