## ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

1. Continuing Notre Dame Students and non-Notre Dame summer students who received notification of their acceptance must report to the J.A.C.C. (Supplemental instructions for enrollment for Summer Institutes, mini-courses, and workshops will be made available by the appropriate program directors.)
2. Non-Notre Dame students who did not receive notification that all of their records (including transcripts) were completely processed, must report to the office of the director of the Summer Session, Room 310, Main Building (Golden Dome) before attempting to enroll.
3. Permission for late enrollment must be obtained in advance from the director of the Summer Session and will be granted under special circumstances only.
4. At the J.A.C.C. in exchange for the completed enrollment form, you will receive your Summer Session "Student Class Schedule", and your summer ID. (Continuing students can use their permanent ID).

## **COURSE SCHEDULE ADDITIONS/CHANGES**

All students may use the DART system through June 25.

After Friday, June 25, 1993:

- 1) Report to the office of the department chair which offers the course you wish to "Drop", "Add", or "Audit" to obtain permission.
- 2) Take the approved form to the Office of Student Accounts (102 Main Building) to adjust your account.
- 3) Then, go to the Office of the Registrar for final processing of the change.

A request shall include your full name, dates of attendance, social security number, address of person, school or company where the transcript is to be sent, your return address, and your signature. There is a charge of \$2.00 for each transcript. A transcript may not be ordered by telephone.

You may send the request by FAX machine instead of mail. However, the transcript itself will be mailed. Our FAX number is (219) 631-5872. Transcripts are normally mailed, but can be picked up in the Registrar's Office, two or three days after receipt of the request. Transcripts given directly to students are stamped ISSUED TO STUDENT. The University issues only transcripts of academic work taken at Notre Dame. Requests for transcripts of work taken at other institutions should be directed to those institutions. Requests for transcripts will not be honored if you are financially indebted to the University.

# FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT ANNUAL NOTIFICATION

---

Each year the University of Notre Dame is required to give notice of the various rights accorded to students pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). Students have a right to be notified and informed. In accordance with FERPA, you are notified of the following:

- 1) **RIGHT TO INSPECT:** You have the right to review and inspect substantially all of your education records maintained by or at this institution.
- 2) **RIGHT TO PREVENT DISCLOSURES:** You have the right to prevent disclosure of personally identifiable information contained in your education records to third parties with certain exceptions allowed by Federal regulations. It is the intent of this institution to limit the disclosure of information contained in your education records of those instances when prior written consent has been given for the disclosure, or when the provisions of FERPA allow such disclosure without prior written consent.
- 3) **RIGHT TO REQUEST AMENDMENT:** You have the right to seek to have corrected any parts of an education record which you believe to be inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of your rights. This right includes the right to a hearing to present evidence that the record should be changed if this institution decides not to alter the education records according to your request.
- 4) **RIGHT TO COMPLAIN TO FERPA OFFICE:** You have the right to file a complaint with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office, Department of Education, 400 Maryland Avenue SW, Washington, D.C. 20202, concerning any alleged failure by this institution to comply with FERPA.
- 5) **RIGHT TO OBTAIN POLICY:** You have the right to obtain a copy of the written institutional policy adopted by this institution in compliance with FERPA. A copy may be obtained in person or by mail from: Office of the General Counsel.

## DIRECTORY INFORMATION

The University has designated certain information contained in the education records of its students as Directory Information for purposes of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

This includes: (1) full name, (2) address, (3) telephone number, (4) date and place of birth, (5) college, major or level, (6) participation in officially recognized activities and sports, (7) weight and height of members of athletic teams, (8) dates of attendance, (9) full or part-time status, (10) degrees and awards received, (11) the most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student, and (12) other similar information such as a photograph.

Directory information may be disclosed by this institution for any purpose, without the prior consent of a student, unless the student has forbidden its disclosure in writing.

Students wishing to prevent disclosure of the designated directory information must file written notification to this effect with the Registrar's Office.

In the event that such written notification is not filed, the University assumes that the student does not object to the release of the directory information.

## STEP TWO

### Register

To enter DART, dial 219-634-3003 from any touchtone telephone or come to the terminal room in the Registrar's Office.

DART will allow you to add, drop, exchange or audit a course, review your schedule, or change a the number of credits of a variable credit course. To end the session, hang up the telephone or enter \* B Y E [Return] on the terminal.

A voice (or terminal) response will guide you after each entry. Follow the instructions. It is not necessary to wait until the entire message is over. If you know what you want to do, go ahead and do it, even if the message is not finished.

Dial the DART telephone number 219 - 634 - 3003  
(4-3003 from Dorm phones) or press the return key [Return] on the terminals).

### Enter DART

Enter your 9-digit student I.D. number (without dashes or spaces), \*

Enter your 4-digit PIN, \*

Enter the Semester Code for the semester in which you are registering (e.g. Summer '93, 9 3 0);

For Example 0 7 1 2 0 6 5 4 4 \* 1 7 7 6 \* 9 3 0

### To add a course

Enter the 4-digit course Call Number followed by #,

For example 0 4 6 6 #.

On the terminal, the return key [Return] is equivalent to the # on the telephone.

If you are NOT already registered in the course, DART will assume you want the course.

DART will confirm that the course has been added.

### To add a course with an authorization number

Enter the 4-digit course Call Number followed by \*

Enter the 6-digit Authorization number and #

For example: 0 4 6 6 \* 1 2 3 4 5 6 #.

### To drop a course

Enter the 4-digit course Call Number followed by #

For example: 0 4 4 6 #

If you are already registered in the course, DART will assume you want to drop the course.

DART will confirm that the course has been dropped.

#### **To list a course**

Enter 1 followed by #. The first course for which you are registered will be given (voice response on the telephone or a listing on the terminal) You can then enter 2# to review your second course, 1# to repeat the first course, etc.

#### **To audit a course**

If you have not registered for the course, enter the 4-digit course Call Number, \*, 4 4 4, and #  
For example: 0 4 6 6 \* 4 4 4 #

If you have registered for the course for credit and wish to audit, enter the 4-digit course Call Number, then \* 4 4 4 and #  
For example: 0 4 6 6 \* 4 4 4 #

If you wish to change an audit course to credit, enter the 4-digit course Call Number, \*, 5 5 5, and #  
For example: 0 4 6 6 \* 5 5 5 #

#### **To change the credits of a variable credit course**

To change the number of credits of a variable credit course for which you have already registered, enter the 4-digit course Call Number, \*, the number of credits, and #.  
For example: To change a variable credit course from 1 to 2 credits,  
enter 0 4 6 6 \* 2 #.

#### **To correct a mistake**

Press \*# and start again. On the terminal, use the backspace key (not the left arrow key).

#### **To end the session**

Just hang up. On the terminal, enter \* B Y E followed by the return key.

#### **To exchange a course**

Enter the 4-digit course Call Number of the course you wish to drop (e.g. 0466), followed by the Call Number of the course you wish to add (e.g. 4500), followed by #.  
For example: 0 4 6 6 4 5 0 0 #.

# GLOSSARY

## COURSE ID

**Call No.** A unique 4-digit identification number. Use this number to request the course and section in DART.

**Dept.** A three or four letter department or discipline abbreviation. See pages 2 and 3 for a complete listing.

**No.** Each course is identified by a three digit number and, in some cases, with a one letter suffix. The suffixes "A", "B", and "C" are used to distinguish different sections of a course when the approach, content or credit hours differ. "D" indicates a drill or demonstration course; "L" indicates a lab course; "R" is for research courses; "S" is for studio courses; "T" is for tutorial courses.

## SEC

Each section of a course has a unique two-digit section number.

## Credit Hours

The number of credit hours associated with the course. "V" indicates a variable credit course. "0.0" is used for non credit courses receiving grades or for courses which are part of another course and for which no separate grade is to be given.

## EXAM

Denotes the final exam type of the course or section.

- C Course with non-departmental final exams
- D Upper-class courses having departmental final exams
- F Freshman Year courses (with departmental final exams)
- N Courses with no final exam

## DAYS

- N Sunday
- M Monday
- T Tuesday
- W Wednesday
- H Thursday
- F Friday
- S Saturday

## Start-End Time

The starting and ending times of the section.

## Instructor

The name(s) of the instructor(s) teaching the section. If no name appears, the instructor will be announced later.

## Comments & Prerequisites

Additional information about the course will be listed here, e.g., beginning and ending dates for mini courses, cross-listed courses, additional meeting times, where taught (if off-campus), restrictions on enrollment in the course.

DART will not allow you to register for a course if you do not have the approved prerequisite(s) or co-requisites.
