Notre Dame, Ind., June 1 -- Nationally prominent, attorneys, judges and government officials will participate in a conference on "The Trial Lawyer --- 1962" to be sponsored by the Notre Dame Law Association here June 6-8.

Plans for the event were announced here today by Judge William B. Lawless, of the Supreme Court, State of New York, who is president of the Notre Dame law alumni organization. Sessions will be held at The Morris Inn beginning with a reception and dinner June 6th (Wednesday) at 6 p.m. Dean Joseph O'Meara of the Notre Dame Law School will address the closing luncheon June 8th (Friday) at 12:30 p.m.

The conference program will get underway June 7th (Thursday) at 9 a.m. with a panel on "Preparation and Technique in the Trial of Negligence Actions." Participants will include Emile Zola Berman, New York, N. Y., past president of the International Academy of Trial Lawyers; Leon Jaworski, Houston, Tex., president of the American College of Trial Lawyers; James P. McArdle, Pittsburgh, Pa., trial specialist; and Prof. John J. Broderick, assistant dean of the Notre Dame Law School, moderator.

Prof. Charles W. Joiner, of the University of Michigan Law School, will address the Thursday luncheon which will honor past presidents of the Notre Dame Law Association. His subject will be "The Civil Jury -- an American Institution."

Lee Loevinger, chief of the Anti-Trust Division, U. S. Department of Justice, will serve as moderator for a panel discussion on "The Trial of Anti-Trust Suits" following the luncheon at 2 p.m. Panelists will include Joseph L. Alioto, San Francisco, Calif.; James H. McGlothlin, Washington, D. C.; and John Paul Stevens, Chicago, Ill., former member of the Attorney General's Committee to Study Anti-trust Laws."

"The Presentation of Proof Before Federal Agencies" will be the subject of an evening panel discussion beginning at 7:45 p.m. (Thursday). Taking part will be Donald C. Beelar, Washington, D. C., former chief counsel of the House Subcommittee on Legislative Oversight; Everett Hutchinson, Austin, Tex., a member of the Interstate Commerce Commission; and Valentine B. Deale, Washington, D. The final business session of the conference will deal with "The Trial of Criminal Cases." Charles S. Desmond, Buffalo, N. Y., Chief Judge of the New York Court of Appeals, will be the moderator. The panelists will be Edward Bennett Williams, Washington, D. C.; and Paul W. Williams, New York, N. Y., former U. S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York.
