Monday, 7:00 P.M., conference by father Irving, Room 222, Main Building.

Tuesday, Vigil of All Saints-- DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE. Six-fifteen P.M., confessions in the basement chapel for the Feast.

Wednesday, Feast of All Saints-- HOLIDAY OF OBLIGATION. Eight-fifteen A.M., Solemn High Mass in the church. Twelve M., plenary indulgence for each visit to the church until Thursday evening.

Thursday, 5:00 to 7:00 P.M., three Masses said by each priest on the campus. Seven-fifteen A.M., Masses begin in Sacred Heart church.
