May Devotions.

The opening of May devotions will take place tonight at 7:32 in the church. Father Irving will preach. Confessions after Benediction. There ~~will~~ be services every Wednesday night with the exception of Wednesday, May 2.

The Novena.

A Novena to the Blessed Virgin is held every year during the first nine days of May. Since the feast of the Assencion occurs May 10, the Novena for the feast will coincide with the other. For the Novena, receive Holy Communion and say the Litany of the Blessed Virgin every day.

Indulgences of the Novena.

An indulgence of 300 days each day, in addition to the indulgences attached to the Litany, and a plenary indulgence on any day of the Novena. For gaining the plenary indulgence there must be a visit to the church and a prayer (five Our Fathers and Hail Marys) for the intention of the Holy Father.
