I have received Holy Communion for about three and one half years that I have been in school. I started to receive daily about the middle of November of the first year I was at Notre Dame and have kept it up since.

During the Freshman year I think that I missed about eight times with not more than two days in succession. In my Sophomore year I started to receive daily about a week after school opened and missed about ten times. The days when I missed generally came about the time we would have vacation. During my Junior year I missed about twelve times. During this year I missed about seven times.

I have practiced daily Communion for three years.
