Novena for the Team.

A Novena for the football team will begin Thursday morning. All out.

Ember Days.

Wednesday, Friday and Saturday are Ember days. All Catholics of 21 years of age or over are obliged to fast; all Catholics are obliged to abstain from meat on these days.

Dispensation.

The Bishop of Fort Wayne has dispensed from the fast and abstinence for all meals taken on the campus on Wednesday and Saturday of Ember weeks. If you eat off the campus tomorrow or Saturday, you may eat meat; if you eat in town, it's fish or eggs.

Other Works of Penance.

You have to something for penance on Ember Days, so the following penances are suggested:

Freshmen: Keep off the Dome.
Sophomores; Lay off the hooch.
Juniors; Study for a change.
Seniors: Stay home from the movies.

Off-Campus.

Read the notes above on Ember Days, and the following paragraph on daily Communion.

For the convenience of off-campus students who wish to receive Holy Communion daily, confessions are heard and Holy Communion distributed in the Walsh Hall chapel from 8:20 a.m. until noon. If you come to the campus before 8:20, go to the basement chapel.
