Palm Sunday.

The services tomorrow recall the triumphal entry of Our Lord into Jewrusalem a few days before His Passion. He was met with great joy by the people whose "Hosanna to the Son of David" was soon turned into the fearful malediction: "His blood be upon us and upon our children!"

The palms blessed before the Mass are a Sacramental. They are to be kept with reverence as signs of God's protection. The same palms, now signs of joy, are burned on Ash Wednesday and sprinkled on our foreheads to show us how fleeting are the joys and the esteem of the world.

The Passion (according to St. Matthew) is read or sung to recall the tragedy which followed so close on the wake of the triumphal entry.

The ceremonies tomorrow and through Holy Week will mean much more to you if you follow them with a Holy Week Book, (pamphlet rack, 40 ¢).
