The Berin Chapel Schedule.

The distribution of Holy Communion begins now in the Berin chapel at 7:30; the basement chapel closes at 7:40. The first morning of the new schedule brought 148 communions, 78 of the communicants being from town. The off-campus total yesterday was 161; Sunday it was 228; Saturday, 99; Friday, 81; Thursday, 77.
