Rosary Devotions Begin at Five.

These prayers will be offered for the intentions handed in by the students. Intentions may be placed in a plate on the communion rail, under the statue of the Sacred Heart. The continuance of the devotions will depend upon their popularity. No one wishes to crowd you, but if you want daily Benediction you can have it.

Don't Lose the Fruit of the Mission.

Long experience shows that it is dangerous to say a word of praise. There were almost six hundred fewer Communions Sunday than there were on the First Friday during the Mission. Blame the dance for it, blame the football game, blame the Bulletin, blame what you will, the fact remains: six hundred students were not sufficiently interested in Holy Communion, in the reception of Our Blessed Lord into their hearts, to be at the rail Sunday morning.

There is always danger of an emotional thrill wearing out; but the Bishop's mission was not emotional. The falling away from Holy Communion was poor headwork. If Our Divine Saviour attracted you through the week, why did you turn away from the attraction on Sunday?
