A Busy Week.

The full religious program of the week is as follows:

Monday - Vigil of All Saints'. Fast and abstinence (dispensed on campus),
5:00 p.m. - Rosary devotions.

Tuesday - Feast of All Saints. Masses at 6:00, 7:00 and 8:30.
Breakfast at 8:00. No student Mass in South Bend.
1:30 p.m. Rosary devotions - students invited.
Visits for Poor Souls from noon till evening.

Wednesday - Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed -- All Souls' Day.
6:15 a.m., Solemn Requiem Mass in the Church for all the
Faithful Departed, with special memento for those whose names
have been handed in. (Place names in envelopes and leave
them on the table at the entrance to the church.)
Visits for the Poor Souls all day.
7:30 p.m., Solemn closing of Rosary devotions (for everyone).

Thursday - Confessions for First Friday -- all day in Sorin chapel, except
1:15 to 3:15 p.m. (class interferes); after supper in the base-
ment chapel; after night prayer in the hall chapels.

Friday - First Friday of November. Mass of Exposition at 6:30 a.m.,
followed by adoration of the Blessed Sacrament all day.
7:30 p.m., Benediction.

Saturday - Offer Holy Communion for the team. Fred Collins and Joe Boland
were out for the season last year after the first few minutes of
the Minnesota game. We don't want the like to happen again.

All week - Novena for Exams (add "Bad News" list).

All Souls' Day.

Take your choice; either hear three Masses in your hall chapel, or attend the Solemn
Mass in the church at 6:15. At the Mass in church, as noted above, there will be
a special commemoration of those of your relatives and friends whom you wish to have
so remembered. Place the names in an envelope to be placed on the altar during
the Mass.

The Visits.

You must receive the Sacraments tomorrow or the next day in order to gain the indul-
gences of All Souls' Day. You can gain a plenary indulgence each time you make a
visit and recite some such prayer as five Paters and Aves for the intentions of the
Holy Father. To separate your visits you must leave the church each time and re-
enter. The indulgences may be gained only in the church, not in the hall chapels.
