Program of the Week.

A vigil, a holyday of obligation, a First Friday, and All Souls' Day mark the week. These require special arrangements. Note the following points:

Thursday - Vigil of All Saints'. Fast and abstinence dispensed.

Friday - Feast of All Saints. Abstinence dispensed.

Masses as on Sunday: 6:00, 7:00, 8:00, 9:00. Breakfast, 8:00.

Holyday of obligation.

First Friday. Mass of Exposition at 7:00.

Adoration with rosary devotions, 7:00 p.M.

Benediction with Litany, 7:30.

No adoration during the day.

Visits for Poor Souls Indulgences from noon Friday till Saturday evening. Conditions: Receive the Sacraments either day and pray each visit for the intentions of the Holy Father.

Saturday - Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed -- All Souls' Day.

Try to hear three Masses. Masses in the church at 6:20, 6:40

and 7:00. The Mass at 7:00 is a Requiem High Mass for the repose of the souls of all the deceased members of the Boy Guidance

Department, offered by request of the central office at New Haven.

Solemn closing of the Rosary devotions at 7:00 p.m.
