Finances.

Last Saturday's Bulletin contained a partial report of offerings for charity during the week. The full report for the week (ending Sunday) is as follows:

For the poor of the parish.....	\$28.79
For Bengal.....	26.00
For the ladies in North Carolina.....	27.10
Sunday collection (for the pamphlet rack).....	101.31
Miscellaneous offering for the pamphlet rack.....	44.76

The pamphlet rack deficit of \$500 reported ten days ago has been reduced \$300 in the meantime, but there are unpaid bills of \$100 accumulated. The \$7.10 reported above as additional to the \$20 sent to North Carolina last week, was gathered in Howard Hall by some students who read Saturday's Bulletin. Finally, there is a nest egg of \$1 for Fr. Barron, in addition to the \$90 already collected for his Korean mission; here's hoping it rounds into \$100 by the addition of another \$9.

Twelve O'clocks For Off-Campus.

The reference is not to midnight permissions, but to the noon adoration periods. It is expected that these will be filled by off-campus students, since most of the campus residents are taking dinner at twelve o'clock.

Return Cards To Your Hall Promoter.
