Caveant Alumni.

If the students of Alumni Hall do not make a more hearty response than they have in the past to the opportunity that has been made for them to receive the Sacraments in the church every morning, the use of the church for this purpose will be discontinued, and Brownson and Carroll Halls will return to the Basement Chapel. The local parish wants the church for their Mission next week, and we will not be justified in retaining it for our own use if the crowd is no larger than it has been during the past week (when 16 was the maximum number from Alumni Hall on one morning). The same holds true of their improvised confessional: there is no sense in asking a priest to walk a quarter of a mile to hear confessions when the two can just as easily come to him.

Don't Force Priests To Serve Mass.

It is very edifying to see one priest serve another's Mass, but it is a sight no layman should ever witness. It is the place of the layman and his privilege - and if he sees a priest serving Mass, he should volunteer to take his place. If he doesn't know how to serve, his ignorance can be easily cured. Fr.
