God's Holy Hand.

Welcome back. And double welcome to incoming Freshmen! Thanks be to God you're safe and sound.

Consecrate this year to Others. Your Eucharistic Calendar explains. Think of Others, pray for them, for the living and the dead.

Last summer while the Hand of God blessed you with buoyant life, It touched Others of Notre Dame's family with accident or illness. Some it beckoned to the seat of judgment.

In Montgomery, Alabama, hometown of Coleman F. Hails, an automobile tragedy overtook him in the brilliant morning of his life. Present sophomores, who lived with him in Zahm Hall last year, recall him well: studious, alert, mature, a daily attendant, often as server, at Mass and Communion, frequent contributor to Scrip, in brief, enjoying to the full the opportunities here for his development, intellectual, physical and especially spiritual. One of the Mission Masses will be celebrated for his soul, and there will be a special Mass arranged for him in one of the sophomore halls, so that his companion residents in Zahm last year may gather in his memory and offer their Holy Communion for his eternal rest.

God also took another of Our Lady's friends, the only honorary alumna of the University: Mrs. Ellen Ryan Jolly of Pawtucket, R.I., LL.D., 1918. Unlike Coleman, she had walked far into the peaceful, shaded evening of this life. Joyous, ardent and tireless, she had three intense loyalties: her Faith, the Blessed Virgin, and the Irish. All three she found at Notre Dame. Hence Notre Dame and you were in her thoughtful prayers for many years. In her long, charitable life she had served as national President of the Ladies' Auxiliary of the A.O.H., and through that organization secured the erection by Congress of a statue in Washington in memory of the Nursing Nuns of the Civil War. The pen used by President Wilson to sign this law was presented to the University in memory of her son, James, who died while a student at Notre Dame.

In her death you did not really lose a friend. Death only made her more powerful, brought her close to the throne of Heaven. This was well expressed in the telegram her son sent announcing her death: "Notre Dame's Lady of the Lake has taken Mother to her bosom. In life her heart was with Notre Dame and in Heaven her constant prayer will be for her loved ones there."

Reserve a place in your prayers also for: His Eminence Cardinal Hayes; Rev. Francis Boeres C.S.C., whose funeral will be Friday, Sacred Heart Church; Brother Emilus (brother of Fr. Ill) who had spent long years of service in the Notre Dame Post Office; Ray J. Dunda, '31, drowned at Lake Geneva; Vincent J. Eck, '15; Jerry Jones, o.s. '14-'16, coach at Columbia College, Dubuque; Dan O'Shea, '30; Ray Cook, steel worker fatally injured by a fall on the Rockne Memorial, baptized on his death bed; Father Aymot, Chicago; Father of Jack Doyle, '38; Mrs. Daniel J. Murphy, aunt of Dan Murphy, '38; father of Dan Bradley (Zahm); father of John Darrouzet (Dillon); Rev. W. Toohig, Boston Archdiocese; mothers of Fr. Wm. Carey, Fr. Misch, Fr. Reddington, and Brother Raphael; sister of Fr. Cunningham; D. F. Kelly, LL.D. '37; brother of E. F. Murray, Supervisor of Employment; father of Clara Luzny (Secy's Office); Robert Drummey, Dorchester, Mass.; Dr. W. Dugan, Battle Creek.

God grant them a place of refreshment, light and peace. Let that be your plea.

Kelly; Tom Shea '09 and Charles Leonard '30 (critically); grandfather of Bob Thomas (Freshman); grandmother of Ed McHugh (Cav.); sister of James (Sorin) and Bob (Mor.) Daley (seriously).
