It's encouraging to go over the prom-  
ises of Our Lord to St. Margaret Mary  
about the practice of making the Nine  
First Fridays. Here's the last one:

I PROMISE THEE, IN THE EXCESS OF  
THE MERCY OF MY HEART, THAT IT'S  
ALL-POWERFUL LOVE WILL GRANT TO  
ALL WHO RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION  
ON THE FIRST FRIDAY OF THE MONTH  
FOR NINE CONSECUTIVE MONTHS THE  
GRACE OF FINAL REPENTANCE AND  
THAT THEY SHALL NOT DIE UNDER MY  
DISPLEASURE NOR WITHOUT RECEIV-  
ING THE SACRAMENTS, AND MY HEART  
SHALL BE THEIR SECURE REFUGE AT  
THAT LAST HOUR.

There are a few students in some of  
the halls who do not put much stock  
in Our Lord's words or in the love  
of the Sacred Heart or in the value  
of their own souls.

If the question of a difficult con-  
fession is what really keeps them away, let them brace up. For Our Lord also said to  
St. Margaret Mary: "Sinners shall find in My Heart an infinite ocean of mercy. I will  
give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts." No priest who loves  
Christ will scare you away from the confessional or treat you unkindly.

If you feel "you want a little more time" or prefer to make a general confession, why  
not get at the end of the line, state your desire, leave the rest with the priest.  
He is only too glad to spend all night for you alone in the hope of reclaiming your  
soul for the length of eternity.

After tonight the Prefect of Religion and his assistants will have their eyes cut as  
they distribute Holy Communion for "those few in some of the halls." This is the  
hour of grace. Christ stands at the gate of their souls and knocks. Let Him in.
