The Catholic Information Society of Narberth Notre Dame.

This Narberth Plan of Karl Rogers and his associates is a gem. It amounts to Christ speaking courteously, through informed, devout and zealous Catholics, to non-Catholics, about His Church.

There is nothing offensive about it. "Bludgeon" is not to be found in the Narberth dictionary. The idea is not to knock the devil out of people who hate papists; nor is it even to ingeniously lasso them and drag them into the Romish Church. Narberth is first and last an information society:

Here, my dear Methodist or Baptist neighbor: Catholics do love the Bible; they are not pro-Fascist; they most certainly are not taught that people of other faiths are not saved. Let me tell you about it.....et cetera.

Narberth operates on the theory that non-Catholics frequently remain ignorant of what Catholics believe because Catholics

do not go out of their way to correct misinformation. Richard Reid and Company (The Catholic Laymen's League of Georgia) by that method of peaceableness and good will slowly but truly shovelled much of the ground from under anti-Catholic bias in many parts of the South.

Narberthmen Rogers et al. (suburban Philadelphians and worthy of the Philadelphia name) began writing little leaflets for their anti-Smith confreres in '28: "What to feed the Kellys on a Friday," "Who likes to go to Confession?" and "Did you ever see a Nun Canoeing?" (Samples and "info" from Mr. Rogers, Box 35, Narberth, Pa.) Today there are 110 Catholic Information Societies at Narberth and 252 secular papers publish their "truth about Catholics" -- papers counting 1,813,956 readers.
