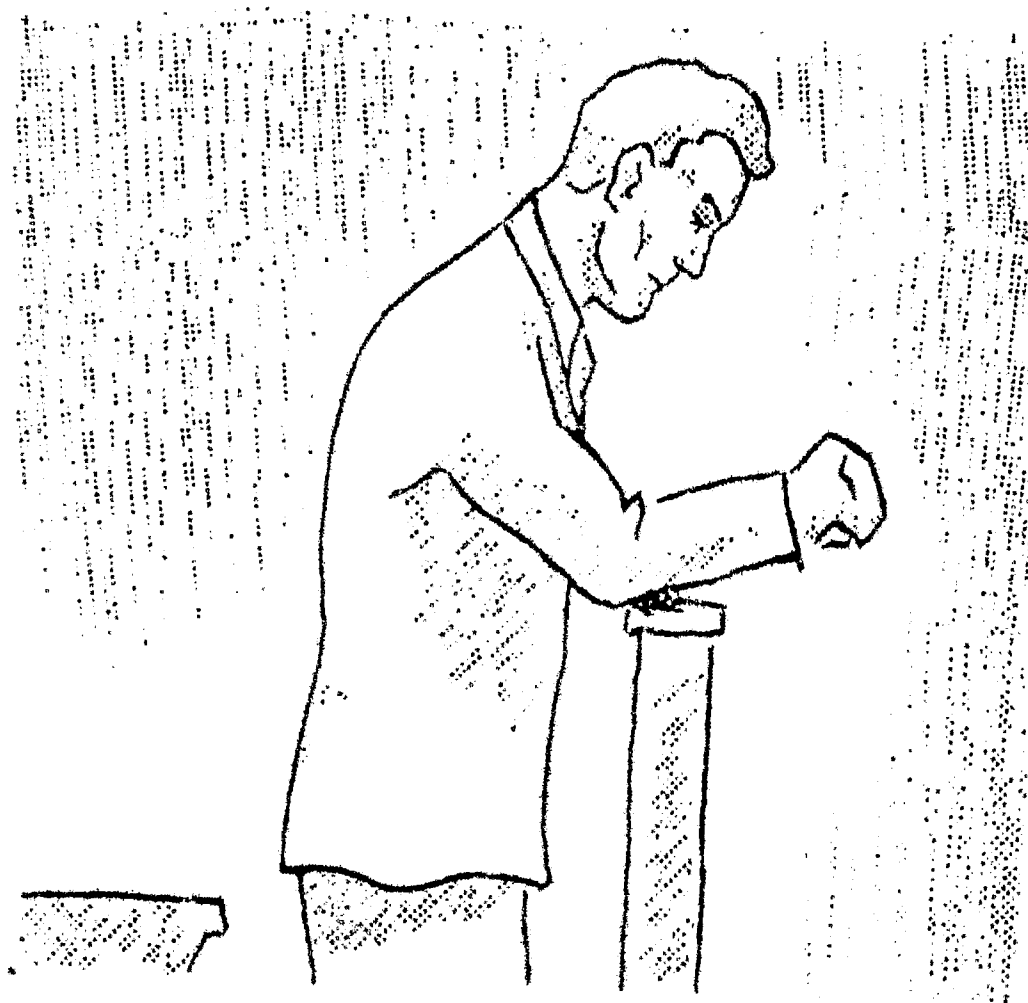

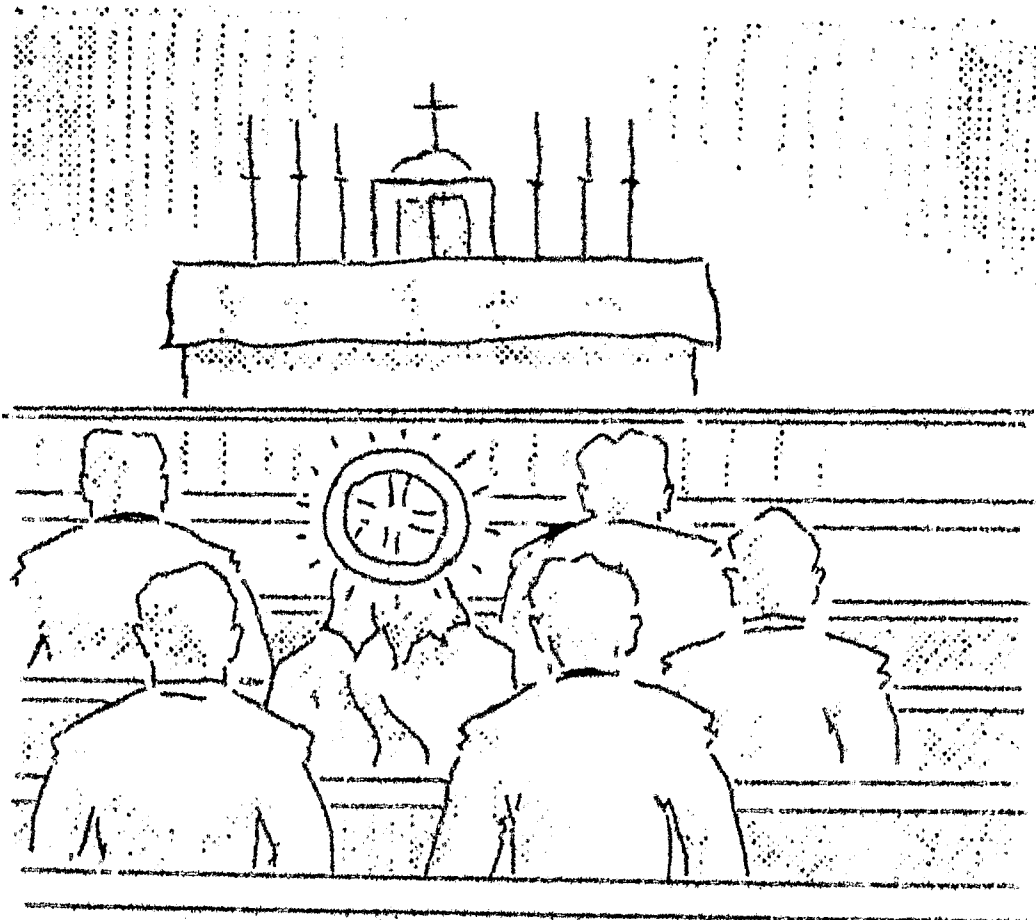
### How Pete Does It.
