### University Mourns Laetare Medalist.

The student body and faculty are asked to pray for the soul of Dr. Charles P. Neill who died in Washington last week. Dr. Neill attended Notre Dame when the University was young. From 1885 to 1888 he was a student. In 1892 he became an instructor and a year later took a Master's Degree. In 1897 John Hopkins awarded him the degree of Doctor of Philosophy.

After receiving his advanced degree, Dr. Neill distinguished himself as Commissioner of Labor under Presidents Roosevelt, Taft, and Wilson. In 1908 Notre Dame bestowed upon him the degree of Doctor of Laws for his outstanding work. After many years in executive capacities, Dr. Neill became director of the National Catholic Service School. He was also a member of the National Child Labor Committee and of the Boy Scouts of America Committee.

In 1922, in recognition of such outstanding achievements, Notre Dame awarded Dr. Neill the Laetare Medal. This splendid Catholic leader put his talents to use. May God grant him a glorious eternity!

### How To Wear The Cassock And Surplice.
