Graduate of '33 Killed In Action.

The Canadian government has just announced that Pilot Officer Lionel V.O. Smith, '33 of El Paso, Texas, was killed in action in India October 3. Lionel received his wings in the Canadian flying school at Winnipeg early in 1941. He had served the allies in England, Gibraltar and India.

Pilot Officer Smith began his university training with the Holy Cross Fathers in their school in Austin, Texas - St. Edward's University, and then he transferred to Notre Dame. His application to study won for him the honor of graduating with special merit, magna cum laude. After graduation he won a scholarship and attended the Harvard University Business School.

A detail in the story of the death of Lionel cannot but draw your attention to his mother, and to all mothers of sons in the service or about to enter. Three hours after receiving a letter from Lionel in which he said he was well and enjoying the fighting in India, his mother received the announcement of his death. She will be pleased to know that you will support her in her sorrow by your prayers.

Mothers the world over are praying for their sons in the armed forces. In many parishes one day of the week is set aside for special prayer for those who have left the parish for the army or navy. On these days the churches are crowded at Mass time. Students can well ask themselves what prayers and acts of sacrifice they are performing for their friends and as a preparation for their life in the Service. It is a hard heart that is unmoved to action at the sight of mothers on their knees at prayer. How many of you are telling the beads every night in honor of the Queen of Peace?

Officer Smith died on his thirtieth birthday. Attend Mass tomorrow for this Notre Dame man. Ask Our Lady, the Patroness of Aviators, to bring him to a glorious birthday - to Eternal Life.
