Stan Pyritz, December '42, now in khaki, writes from Fort Harrison, Indiana.

"Dear Father: Just thought I'd drop you a line or two to let you know where your #1 server is . . .

"This army life is sure swell. Father. We get up at 5:30, roll call at 6:10, and then eat. We make our own bunks, and sweep and mop the barracks, so it isn't quite like Notre Dame. They had enough W.A.A.C.'s at Sheridan to give us room service.

"Boy am I tired today. I was on K.P. yesterday. We got up at 4:45 and began to work around 5:15 A.M. And we were working, on our feet, constantly, with but a little time out for chow, until almost 9:00 last night. I don't mind work, but 16 hours is too much at one time. Oh well, someone has to do it, and everyone gets it in time.

"I've been hitting the "rail" pretty regularly. I started New Year's and kept going until the end of January. Then I slipped up, and started again when I got in the Army . . . Give my gang my regards, and tell Fr. Walsh hello for me."
