A Reminder To The "Once A Year Boys".

Christ is responsible for making Holy Communion an obligation for Catholics. Our Savior reveals that a man will die spiritually unless he eats the Bread of Life: "Unless you eat my Flesh and drink my Blood, you cannot have Life in you." The Catholic Church, through which God speaks and teaches, has specified the period between the First Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday, next Sunday, as the Easter Duty time for the United States. All Catholics are obliged to receive Holy Communion during that interval. Failure to abide by the command of the Church is a mortal sin. Are you dead or dying?
