The Call For Prayers.

A day seldom passes without a call coming to the office of the Chaplain for your prayers. Requests come in every form, by telegraph, V-Mail from the front, long distance telephone, airmail and letter. Former students write in, and alumni and friends of Notre Dame who have never visited the campus. Your prayers have more than ordinary power in their opinion because of your closeness to the Blessed Sacrament and to the Grotto.

You should keep the BULLETIN prayer requests as a permanent memento in your Masses and Communions. When you notice the name of an acquaintance in need of prayers for himself or for others, assist at Mass for him, and thereby display your charity. The story behind some of the recent requests will show you the good your prayers can do.

The mother and sister of Jim Mazar (Al) are in the hospital. Jim's mother is suffering from two broken ribs and his sister from a broken leg fractured in three places, the result of being rundown by an autoist.

Sgt. Bob McDonnell, ex. '46, of Chicago and of St. Edward's Hall last semester, has been badly wounded fighting with the Army in Italy. A letter Bob's mother received from the Catholic Chaplain at the front says that Bob was ordered to wipe out a German machine gun nest planted on a hillside. Bob fulfilled the orders, but on his return to his lines he was caught in the machine gun fire of a surprise attack. His legs, arms and chest were severely injured.

Last week you were informed about the illness of Dave Champion's (ROTC) sister. She is suffering from polio. And now two more cases have been reported to the Chaplain. The sister of Steve Provost (Car) is in serious condition, and a close friend of Harold Wismann (Dil) is paralyzed.

Jim Nowery, '29, of Shreveport, La. writes asking for the prayers of BULLETIN readers for Don Laskey, '27, who died in July leaving a wife and three daughters. Brother Vitus, C.S.C., who is in Austin, Texas asks for prayers for his deceased sister-in-law. The brother of Tom Dooley (St. Eds) has been injured in France. The brother of Bob Brennan (Dil) is missing in the Aleutians. The brother of Brother Emilian, C.S.C., has been killed in France. Walter Kennedy of the Publicity Dept. will undergo an operation soon. The brother of Don Murphy (Z) was killed in South Pacific action. The brother of Len Whitaker (Z) was killed in Italy. Sgt. Bob Newland, brother of Sgt. Jim Newland, '41 and friend of Joe Walker (Sor) has been reported killed in action.
