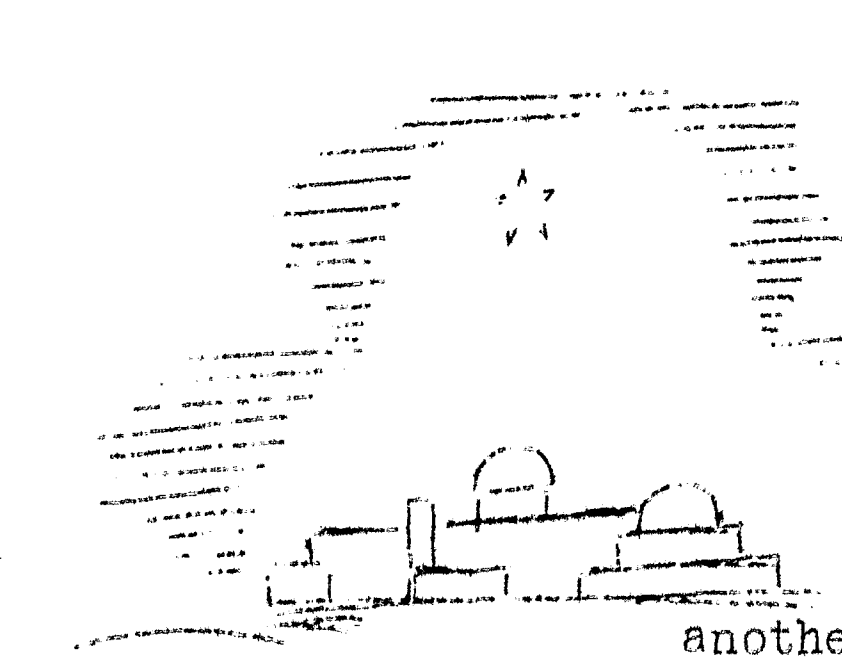
Adoration All Day Friday.

The mail brought this short notice last week. "Archbishop Cushing has established at St. Clement's Church, Boston, a Shrine of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Every day of the month, from seven o'clock in the morning until nine in the evening, men and women -- known as the Knights and Ladies of the Blessed Sacrament, watching one hour each month -- keep unceasing adoration. On Friday nights -- in hourly shifts, from nine o'clock in the evening until seven Saturday morning -- men, Knights of the Blessed Sacrament, maintain adoration."

The purpose of this is to make reparation to God for our own sins and the sins of the world, that God's Will may be done on earth, that God may bless our earth and grant us permanent peace.

That will be the purpose of the Adoration at Notre Dame next Friday, the First Friday of the month. If these businessmen and busy housewives can find time for a full hour of adoration, there is a way for you to set aside a half-hour sometime during the day. The cure of the world's ills rests on all, not on a few. Remember the good you are doing when you kneel in prayer before Our Blessed Savior.

Your First Friday program should run like this: Mass and Holy Communion in your hall chapel for the recovery of Bob Hintz, a half-hour of Adoration and Benediction at 7:00 P.M. (Adoration: from 8:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. in the Church).
