BOB NELSON IS DYING

A long-distance phone call brings the sad news that Bob Nelson of Zahm hall is dying. He is in the hospital at his home in Joliet, Illinois. There is absolutely no hope for Bob. He is paralyzed from the chest down. He will die within a few days--the priest thinks about Saturday.
