Another Happy Death.

Don Juster of Badin Hall died Saturday evening at 10:25 in the hospital at Michigan City. Don was brought to the hospital Monday night after an auto accident in which he received terrible shock, deep scalp and face lacerations and broken ribs. From the beginning the broken ribs made it most difficult for him to breath, even with the aid of an oxygen tent.

On Friday the doctor found it necessary to operate and remove a portion of a broken rib which had pierced the lung causing a three inch gash. Don recovered from the operation nicely. He recognized those who were permitted to visit him, and chatted with them for short periods, and then would fall back into sort of restless sleep. Even after the operation he did not seem to be in a critical condition. The death struggle came unexpectedly and lasted but a few minutes. The chaplain who has seen Don only a short while before he died, left the hospital after making his round of visits, so normal did Don look.

Don knew he had been anointed. He spoke about having been to confession. When asked about prayer, he said that he had said a lot of them. He made only one request--that the students pray for him in his sufferings.

Don died well-prepared to appear before the Judgment Seat of God, which is another way of saying he died a happy death.

Our Blessed Lord gave this happy death to Don as a reward for his efforts to be faithful to prayer and the Sacraments. The Communion rail under the pulpit was Don's favorite spot for receiving the Eucharist on Sunday. The chapel in Dillon Hall was another sanctuary he often visited for Communion and Mass. Our Blessed Mother can speak of his numerous visits to the Grotto.

Don is the second student to die this semester. Joe Hailer died by accident also, in the St. Mary's Gate tragedy. Both Don and Joe were ready to face their Judge. For this favor we wish to make a public act of gratitude to Our Lady, who keeps a watchful eye on the children of her Notre Dame family.
