You can go down to Purgatory with Christ. This is done only at Mass time. In the Holy Sacrifice, Christ joins His prayer to ours, making ours most acceptable to God our Father. The Mass sends more souls to Heaven from Purgatory than any other prayer, simply because of the power of Christ's petition. All the prayers of Our Blessed Mother, along with all the saints and angels, for an eternity, will never equal the power of a single Mass. Don't miss the easy opportunities you have on the campus.
