Conditions For Gaining Holy Year Indulgence. . . . (Save This.)

The Holy Father has extended to the entire world the privileges of the Holy Year of Jubilee. By virtue of this the faithful everywhere outside of Rome may gain the Jubilee Indulgence as often as they fulfill the prescribed works. This extension of the Holy Year will endure up to midnight of December 31, 1951.

What does this mean to you? Few of you were able to make the pilgrimage to Rome last year to gain the Jubilee Indulgences. With few exceptions, all indulgences applicable to the living were suspended during the Holy Year. This suspension was lifted on December 25 last. On the practical side, it will be well for you to remove such temporal punishment as is still due to you for forgiven sins by gaining as many indulgences as you can while you may, and to be most careful not to pile up such punishment during this Holy Year extended. The remission of all temporal punishment due to sin could mean everything to you, spiritually.

Conditions.

In order to gain the Jubilee Indulgence these conditions are to be fulfilled: 1) Confession and Communion; 2) Four visits to designated church; and 3) Certain prescribed vocal prayers.

1. CONFESSION AND HOLY COMMUNION: No one may be dispensed from either of these requirements with the sole exception of the sick who are physically unable to receive Holy Communion. The annual confession made to fulfill the Easter duty, and the prescribed Paschal Communion, do not suffice for the purpose of gaining the Jubilee Indulgence. It must be non-obligatory Confession and Communion. In making the Jubilee Confession it is advisable to state the fact to your confessor. The Jubilee Communion should likewise be specified by your own intention.

2. VISITS TO CHURCH: The faithful must make one visit to each of four designated churches. In every case their parish church can be one of these. All the visits may be made on the same or different days. When it is permissible to make all visits to the same church, the visits should be interrupted by actually going out and then returning.

Note for Notre Dame students: the four visits may be made to the church or chapel of their institution. Sacred Heart Church is so considered.

3. PRAYERS: In addition to the prayers that personal piety might suggest, the following prayers must be recited on the occasion of each prescribed visit to the church.

- a. The Our Father, Hail Mary and Gloria, five times;
- b. The Our Father, Hail Mary and Gloria, once for the intentions of the Holy Father;
- c. The Apostles' Creed;
- d. The Hail Mary three times with the additional invocation "Queen of Peace, pray for us";
- e. The prayer: Hail, Holy Queen--once. (Page 27, Notre Dame Prayer Book.)

General Notes.

1. The Jubilee Indulgence may be gained for oneself or for the dead. . . 2) The Indulgence may be gained as often as the prescribed works are fulfilled. However, the previous series, including Confession and Communion, should be completed before the second one is started. . . 3) The last of the prescribed works must be performed in the state of grace. It is therefore recommended that the Jubilee Communion be made after the visits and prayers.
