"Twenty per cent of an estimated one and three quarter billion Christmas cards carried a religious theme, this year. That's THREE TIMES what it was last year."

TEXAS LOGIC!! "The Baptist General Convention in Texas passed a resolution opposing Good Friday as a legal holiday on the grounds of separation of Church and State ... If this is LOGIC, then what about Christmas? And what about the Sunday observance? We don't get it."

"The birthrate among Catholics for the past ten years has been 40% higher than the birthrate of the nation at large.
