About Vacation

It's the strong character that changes the tone of his environment -- while the average character tends to follow rather than to lead.

No man, entitled to a college education, has any business with a weak character. No man who has had a year at Notre Dame should have a weak character. No man with any ambition to be somebody will allow environment to make a monkey out of him.

Many of you are going to be confronted with old occasions of sin -- liquor, coarse companions, gambling, wild parties, contempt for authority, etc. No man of prudence will deliberately go into an occasion of sin; no man of character will renew a companionship which he knows to be dangerous. And so, if the old gang, or old friend, is dangerous for you, show your spirit. Try out your qualities of leadership.

If you don't display spunk, then you haven't learned much this year at Notre Dame. By your actions you preach the Gospel of the Church and of this school.
