## Pope Explains Name ; Willing to Be Martyr

"This name is dear to us," the Holy Father said, "because it is the name of our father and it is the titular name of the parish where we were baptized." He recalled that John was the name of two saints closest to Jesus and of a long line of successors to St. Peter.

Pointing to the great number of previous Popes named John, the Holy Father stated: "We have preferred to cover the littleness of our name with this magnificent succession of Roman Pontiffs."

Then the new Pope continued: "And St. Mark the Evangelist, the protector of our beloved Venice and whom St. Peter loved as his own son, was not his first name also John?"

"John the Baptist, the precursor of Our Lord, was truly invincible testimony of truth, justice, and liberty in preaching, in Baptism, in penance, and in bloodshed.

"And the other John, disciple and evangelist, favorite of Christ and His most sweet Mother, who at the Last Supper rested on the Lord's chest, de-

rived from this that charity of which he was the living and apostolic flame until advanced old age.

"May it be God's will that both of the Johns cry out in all of the Church that our most humble pastoral ministry—which follows that of Pius XII, our mourned predecessor, and those of his predecessors—may call upon the clergy and all the people to 'make ready the way of the Lord . . . and the crooked way shall be made straight, and the rough way smooth, and all mankind shall see the salvation of God (Luke iii, 4-6)'."

Urging his people to love one another, "because this is the greatest Commandment of the Lord," the Pope concluded:

"May God kindly grant, Venerable Brothers, that we, bearing the same name as the first of a series of Supreme Pontiffs, may with the help of divine grace have this same sanctity of life and steadfastness of mind, and, if it is the will of God, may we go as far as the shedding of blood." [Pope St. John I was a martyr in 526.]

Please keep this intention in your prayers.

THE NOVENA FOR THE PURG SOULS continues until November 12. There is still time to make a novena of your own during this month of the holy souls, if you did not start with everyone else.

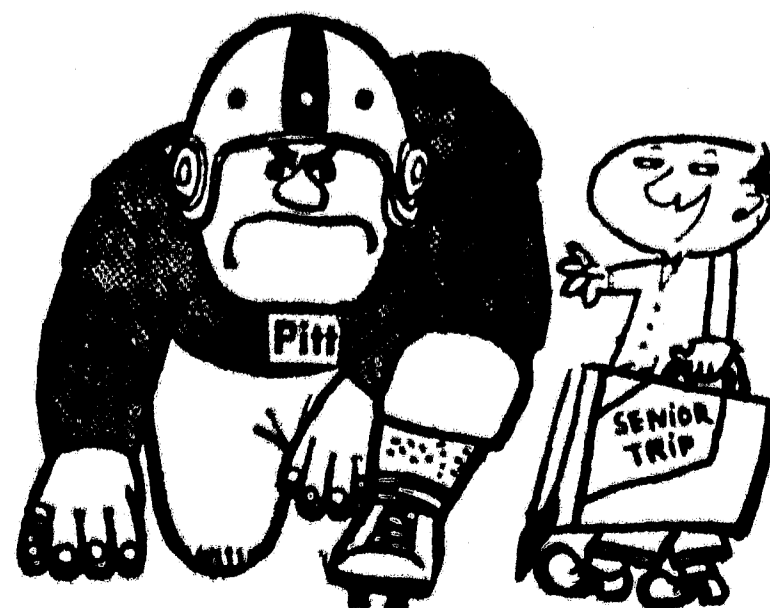
