Inter-hall competitions of various sorts will get underway in a few days. So, here's a bit of good advice called:



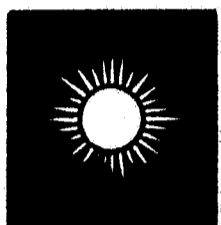
THE TEN COMMANDMENTS OF SPORTS
