Most of you have been enrolled in the Apostleship of Prayer. And if you haven't yet, you can do so by giving your name to your Hall Chaplain. Membership requires that you be faithful to the practice of the Morning Offering each day. This is the only essential obligation in order that you may share in the spiritual benefits of membership. This may be done in any words, but the following is the recommended form:

O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer Thee my prayers, works, joys and sufferings of this day, for all the intentions of Thy Sacred Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, in reparation for my sins, for the intentions of all our Associates, and for the General Intention recommended this month.

As a member of the Apostleship of Prayer, you have a share in the prayers of all members throughout the world and in the merits and prayers of many Religious Orders. You have a special title to the blessings promised by Our Lord to St Margaret Mary in favor of souls devoted to His Sacred Heart. By the practice of the Morning Offering, the merit of each action of the day is increased. Members receive Holy Communion on First Fridays and strive to make frequent use of the Sacraments.

Members of the Apostleship of Prayer obtain a plenary indulgence on the First Friday and First Saturday of every month. Our Lord Himself chose the First Friday of each month for the special worship of His Sacred Heart. As a manifestation of your love for the Sacred Heart and in reparation for the sins of ingratitude and irreverence committed against Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, receive Holy Communion this Friday and every First Friday.

A plenary indulgence may also be gained by members of the Apostleship of Prayer as often as, having confessed and received Communion of Reparation, they visit a church or chapel and pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff. Keep this in mind in the

days ahead, as we ask your prayers for the Holy Father in anticipation of his 80th birthday.

Members are encouraged to join a devotion to Our Lady's Immaculate Heart to their devotion to the Sacred Heart of Our Divine Lord.

**The Promises of Our Lord  
to Saint Margaret Mary

1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
2. I will establish peace in their homes.

I promise thee in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who communicate on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor without receiving their Sacraments. My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.
