THE FEAST OF THE UNSUNG HEROES

All Saints' Masses

The schedule of Masses tomorrow will be the same as on Sunday. For early risers there are Masses at 5:00 and 6:00 a.m. in the Crypt. The last Mass in Sacred Heart Church will be at 12:15. There will be no 5:10 p.m. Mass on All Saints' Day.

Confessions will be heard tonight between 6:00 and 8:30 in Sacred Heart Church. Give Halloween some of its original meaning by preparing to participate in All Hallows' Mass with undivided attention instead of in the confession line.

From tomorrow noon until midnight Friday a visit to a church or chapel will gain for the Poor Souls a plenary indulgence. Conditions: Six Paters, Aves, Glorias for the Holy Father; the state of grace; confession and Communion.

REWARDS FOR FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTIONS

Tonight the *Bulletin* recalls the twelve promises Our Lord made to all those who practice and promote devotion to His Sacred Heart, especially the devotion of the Nine Fridays.

- 1) I will give them all the graces necessary for their state in life.
- 2) I will give peace to their families.
- 3) I will console them in all their troubles.
- 4) They shall find in My Heart an assured refuge during life, and especially at the hour of death.
- 5) I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
- 6) Sinners shall find in My Heart the source and an infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7) Tepid souls shall become fervent.
- 8) Fervent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection.
- 9) I will bless the homes in which the image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored.
- 10) I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.
- 11) Those who propagate this devotion shall have their names written on My Heart, never to be effaced.
- 12) I promise thee, in the excess of the mercy of My Heart, that Its all-powerful love will grant to all who receive Holy Communion on the First Friday of every month, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance and that they shall not die under My displeasure, nor without receiving the Sacraments; and My Heart shall be their refuge at that last hour.
