Keenan-Stanford Sunday Mass Schedule

Sunday, a new schedule of Masses goes into effect in Keenan-Stanford chapel. The new times -- 8:30, 9:45, 11:00, and 12:15 -- are incidental to the purpose which is to allow sufficient time for Masses with more complete participation in the liturgy.

For the next five Sundays, that is, all the Sundays of Lent before the beginning of the Easter vacation, the Masses in Keenan-Stanford will be under the direction of Father William McAuliffe, C.S.C., who, as pastor of Sacred Heart Parish, initiated participation of the laity in the parish Masses. There will be dialogue, some commentary, instruction each Sunday on the Mass, offertory procession, and eventually hymns and the high Mass sung by the congregation.

Anyone on campus interested in this type of participation in the Mass is welcome to Keenan-Stanford chapel. Freshmen, on the other hand, may attend Mass in Sacred Heart Church, but it is hoped that since the new schedule of Masses is being implemented on their side of the campus, the freshmen will take special interest in them.

Moreau Retreats

Again this year two closed retreats have been set up at Moreau Seminary for students from this side of the campus. The first begins Friday evening, March 15, and lasts until Sunday, March 17. (From reactions already received to this date, this retreat will be for the non-Irish.) The second retreat is set up for the weekend of March 29-31.

Several students have expressed an interest in these retreats, and already a group of Badinites, from whom the impetus for these retreats came this year, has practically filled the second retreat.

The nominal cost of these retreats is \$5.00 -- which covers food and lodging in Moreau Seminary from Friday evening until Sunday afternoon. The reservation should be accompanied by a \$2.00 down payment, and it should be sent in immediately as accommodations are limited. Be sure to state whether you are interested in the March 16 or the March 30 retreat.
