SUMMER SERVICE PROJECT IN TOLEDO---Mike Barron reflects on his experience: "The life expectancy for women in this nation is five years longer than men. This might seem like just another statistic for the census bureau to brood over. For someone working or living in a nursing home, however, this fact takes on a great deal of importance. It means that for most men in a nursing home, life can be awfully lonely. Their life-long male friends and brothers, their peers, are probably dead. They feel intimidated in a world dominated by women. They were happy to see a male volunteer."

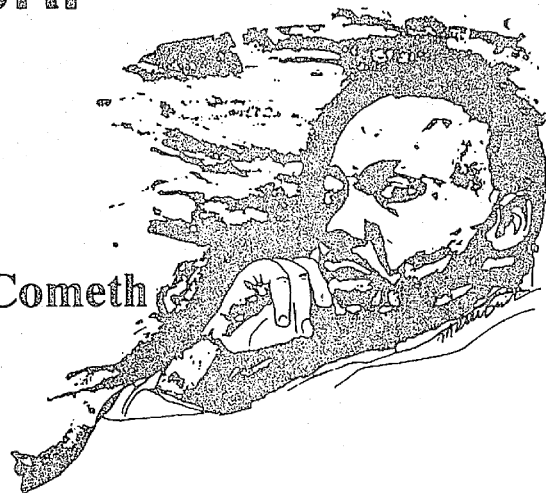

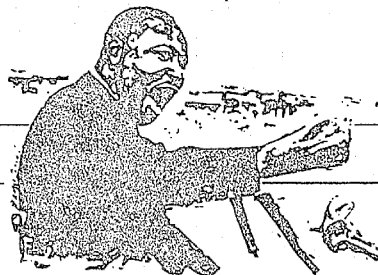


*Now that he is safely dead
