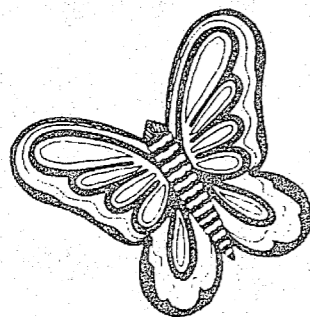

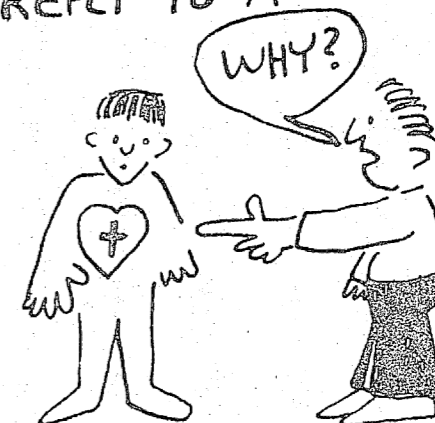

CHRIST HAS COME UNINVITED.

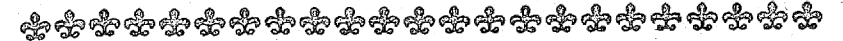
But because he cannot

but the world at its worst.

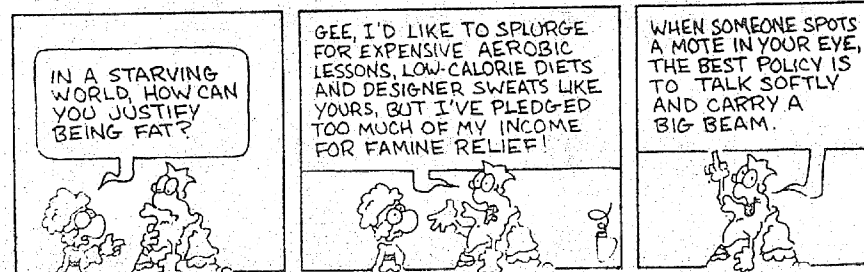
