Tom Esposito Learns About Himself While Helping Others

Tom Esposito, a senior business major and former Keenan resident, had a summer job that changed his life.

Tom worked for the Department of Social Services in Virginia Beach, VA, helping sexually and physically abused kids. He describes his responsibility as being a full-time big brother: counseling the kids, arranging for doctors' appointments, and acting as an advisor to the court.

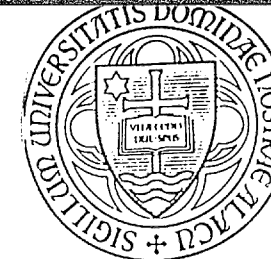
"I can't compare my work in Virginia Beach with any other summer job," said Tom. "It was an eye opening experience in the real world."

He enjoyed his job so much, Tom plans on making social service his career and wants to return to Virginia Beach and continue his work.

Tom was first introduced to social service through the Center for Social Concerns. He wanted to do something meaningful with his summer, so he applied for a Summer Service project and was assigned to the Foster Care Unit in Virginia Beach. He had no intention of making social service his career, but found the work more rewarding than anything else he had tried.

"Summer Service Projects are a great opportunity for anyone who wants to try community service," said Tom. "I wish everyone could have the chance to experience it."

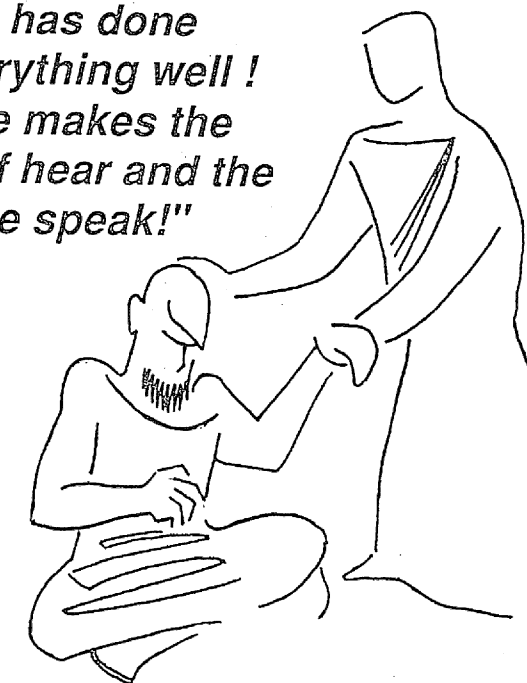
All project participants receive a \$1200 credit on their tuition in return for their work. If you are interested in a Summer Service Project, or any other community service, contact Tom at 272-0196.
