

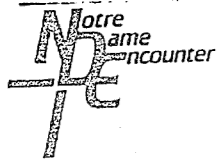
# URBAN CHANGE

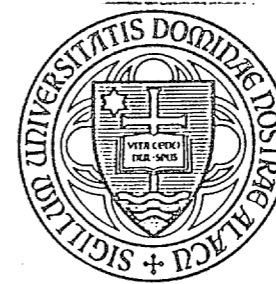

to be loved as to love.

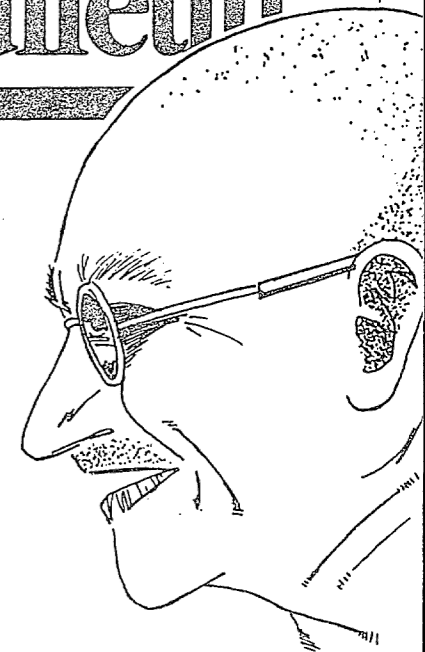
For it is in giving that we

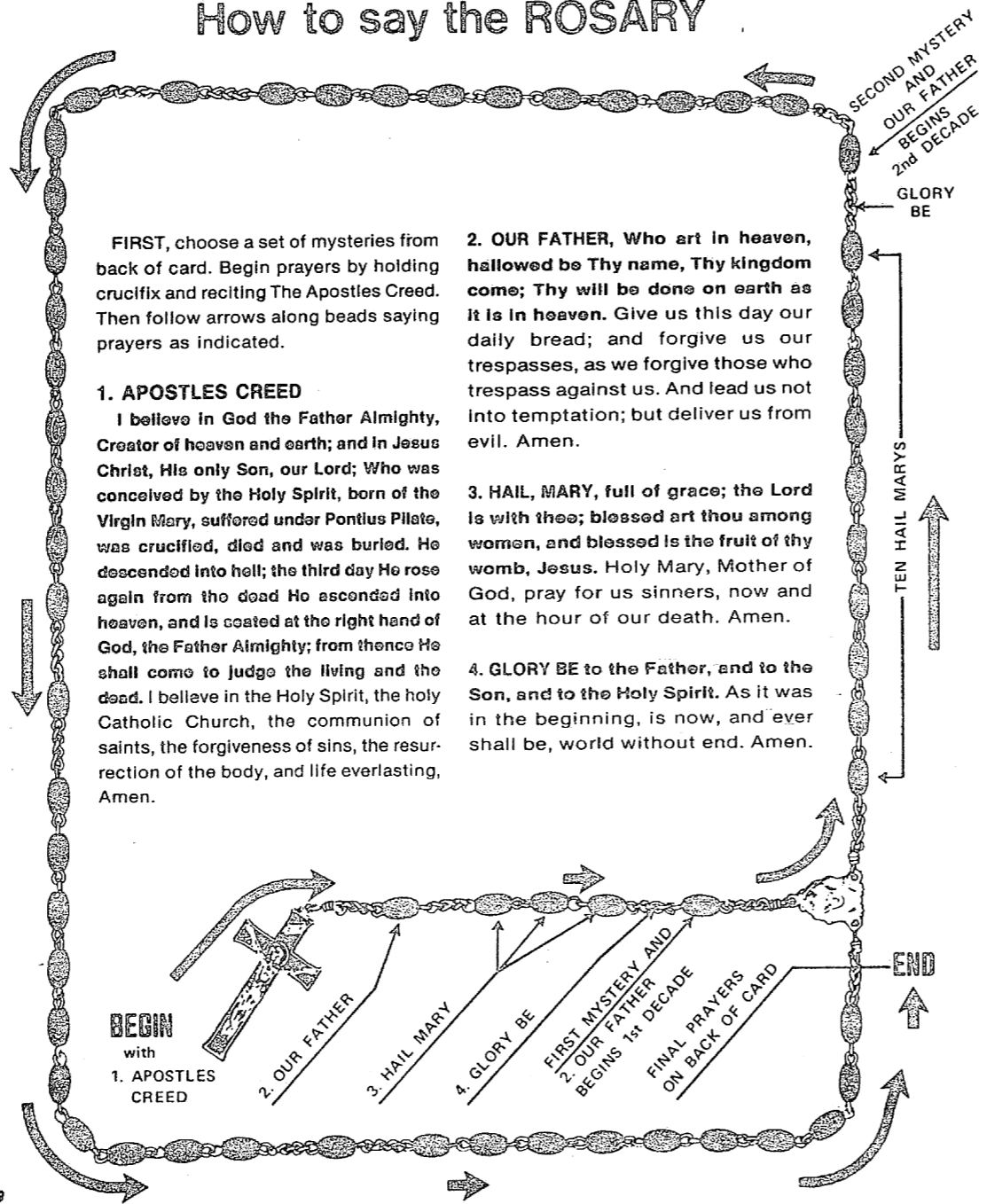

## How to say the ROSARY



FIRST, choose a set of mysteries from back of card. Begin prayers by holding crucifix and reciting The Apostles Creed. Then follow arrows along beads saying prayers as indicated.

### 1. APOSTLES CREED

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord; Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting, Amen.

**2. OUR FATHER, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. Amen.**

**3. HAIL, MARY, full of grace; the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.**

**4. GLORY BE to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.**

NOTE: When two or more are saying the rosary together, the Leader recites the part of the prayers printed in heavy type and others recite the rest of the prayer together.

The Rosary is divided into 5 decades. Each decade consists of the Our Father, ten Hail Marys, and the Glory Be.

You may add after each Glory Be: "Oh my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy."
