Athletes must train long and arduously, and use all of their talents and ingenuity if they are to make the team, win the contest. They compete with all their strength.

GOD IS LOVE 

God invites each of us to respond to Him with everything we have by loving our neighbor. No mention is made of the kind of neighbor we must love. All neighbors, near and far away, are included. As we make room for God in our lives, we will see him in our neighbors, even the least of them. As we reach out and love our neighbors, even the least of them, we will become more aware of God.
